

It revels in the ugly, the horrible, and the imperfect and asks us to question long-held standards of beauty and behavior. In 1990 Steig's fractured fairy tale put us on notice - the days of traditional fairy tale tropes are numbered. And 25 years later the repulsive Shrek continues to explode myths, pass gas, and encourage us to examine our own prejudices. Long live the weird!

We look forward to seeing you in our classes, onstage, behind the scenes, and in the audience for what promises to be a thrilling 35th anniversary season of transformative productions.
