

Dear Theatre-goer,

Welcome to Annie, the premiere production of our 30th anniversary season! Director and WFT founder Jane Staab writes,

Annie's story is as relevant today as it was when it first captivated a nation in the throes of the Great Depression and reminds us of the unremitting disparity between rich and poor. I framed this production in the world of radio because it was through radio—and the mind's eye of the listener—that Annie came most vitally alive. Sitting in their kitchens and living rooms, the radio audience conjured images of the dreary orphanage, the lavish mansion, the teeming streets of New York City, and of Annie herself. They resonated with the message that, in the midst of despair, we need to hold onto our dreams.

Annie is smart and rebellious; she resists the path of least resistance. She holds onto her dream. She runs away. When that doesn't work, she gets creative—and she <u>earns</u> her chance at a better life. Warbucks, at the other end of American society, has all the material goods he wants. He earned them with the same work ethic, creativity, and tenacity that he recognizes in Annie.

That they are drawn to each other has nothing to do with their economic status but with emotional need. They find each other because of their need for deep human connection. And, in finding each other, they tell us what is truly important in this story and in life.

Anniversaries are a time to reflect on the past and a time to look forward. In our very first program, in 1981, I wrote, "We think that it is important to provide high quality theatre at affordable prices for a family audience. We hope that the diversity represented onstage and backstage reflects the diversity to be found in that audience. At the heart of WFT is the belief that the quality of the dramatic experience can have a positive influence on the life experience of children and families. We hope you agree and keep coming back." It is gratifying to see that we have remained committed to our original intentions and that so many of you have returned time and time again.

This season promises to be bigger and better than ever. We have enlarged our mainstage offerings to include our collaborations with BalletRox and Boston Lyric Opera; added a number of special events; and enhanced our Extra Extras program. One way we have chosen to celebrate our 30 years is by honoring people who have made outstanding contributions to the life of WFT. We will do this at each public performance all season long.

As was true 30 years ago, the future of the Wheelock Family Theatre will be determined by you—the members of our audience. We hope you enjoy *Annie*, and we look forward to your continued support.
