Andrea T. Healy (Stage Manager) has enjoyed her 1st season at WFT. In addition to stage managing, she teaches creative drama here and at the Jewish Community Center in Newton. In her spare time, she's also the co-manager of WFT's box office. This summer, Andrea will return to her native Cape Cod to stage-manage at Wellfleet Harbor Actor's Theatre. Tim Jozwick (Set Designer), a member of the Emerson College design faculty since 1985, is resident designer for Chamber Stage and WFT.
