Dear Theatre-goer,



Tuck Everlasting holds a unique place in WFT's history. This musical adaptation of Natalie Babbitt's novel was written especially for us by Harald Bakken. Until Harald's untimely death in 1998, he was one of the Theatre's biggest fans.

Notable among Harald's contributions was the clarity, commitment, and vision he brought to our Advisory Board as a charter member and as chairman for more than 10 years. Perhaps most fun for him was playing such parts as The King of Hearts in *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland*, the Professor in *Our Town*, and the Rabbi in *Fiddler on the Roof*. Most meaningful to Harald, however, was writing the book, lyrics, and score for his adaptation of *Tuck*. Knowing how happy writing and mounting *Tuck* made Harald, I want to share the program notes he wrote on the occasion of the play's premiere 10 years ago:

During the past four years, as I wrote and rewrote their story for the stage, I grew to love Winnie Foster and the everlasting Tucks. "Grew" is the crucial word there. For their tale -- ostensibly about immortality and its possible consequences, and therefore about death and its role in our lives -- is really about human growth. Because Winnie grows as she does, the story of Tuck Everlasting -- though sometimes sad -- is ultimately life-affirming.

And so I want to thank those who helped me grow as I wrote this, my first play: Natalie Babbitt, who generously allowed me to adapt her novel and encouraged me with her responses to my efforts; Jane Staab, whose unerring dramatic sense and shrewd musical judgment led me to new understandings about the theatre; and Sue Kosoff who, as she guided me from my first fumbling efforts at playwriting through to a completed script, performed the miracle of being simultaneously both a tough-minded mentor and a warm-hearted friend.

By allowing me to be part of her growth, my daughter, Martha, has added immeasurable richness to my life. My wife, Marjorie, has gifted me with new beginnings and sustained me with unlimited love. She lifts my spirit with the promise of many more years of wonderful growth together. I dedicate the play to Marjorie.

Although we will miss him taking his playwright's bow at the end of each performance, the joy that Harald brought to all of us who loved him is truly everlasting.
