ABOUT:

Boston's most beloved story comes to life for the first time this winter in a musical adaptation of Robert McCloskey's book *Make Way for Ducklings*. Fans will be delighted by the playfulness of this story, as well as its tremendous ode to Boston. Mr. and Mrs. Mallard and their Ducklings bring us on a journey of new beginnings through a series of Boston city landmarks – Boston Public Garden, Beacon Hill including the State House and Louisburg Square, Longfellow Bridge, Charles River, and finally the ducklings make their way down Mt. Vernon St., Charles St., and Beacon St. back to the Boston Public Garden. Each seemingly small corner provides new adventures and challenges. Through song and dance, the ducklings bring us on their journey of self discovery, family and the meaning of "home".

"As we were all increasingly at home during the pandemic, the question of 'what makes a home' took on new meanings. Mr. and Mrs. Mallard's quest for a forever home and the community that surrounds it resonated all the more", says Director Emily Ranii and Artistic Director of Wheelock Family Theatre. Audiences will be enveloped by their love for their community in this triumphant and heartfelt tale.

Ranii leapt at the chance for WFT@BU to be part of the adaptation of this quintessential Boston show – "It's a tour of the city we call "home", she says. Patrons from all over will fall for the endearing Mallard family, and Boston-based fans especially will hold a special connection to the story they hold so near and dear. "Even though this work started before I moved to the Boston area, so much of the play has been enhanced by my immersion into the Boston Community", says Co-writer and co-creator, Michael J. Bobbitt.

When the ducklings begin to explore the world around them, the challenges of parenthood in the busy Boston environment create a fun bit of family drama. A classic story for all ages, this world premiere musical celebrates family, Boston, children and the beings who make an unfamiliar place a home. Directed by WFT@BU Artistic Director Emily Ranii, Music Directed by Jon Goldberg, and Choreographed by Joy Clark.
