

WFT continues its season-long celebration of 'the power of friendship' with the Broadway musical, A Year with Frog and Toad. This Tony Award-nominated musical is the perfect story to enjoy this holiday season, providing audiences of all ages an opportunity to see theater with the ones you love.

Based on the popular children's books by celebrated author Arnold Lobel, WFT's A Year with Frog and Toad brings Lobel's loveable characters off the page with vibrant music, dynamic choreography and imaginative storytelling, transporting audiences into a vivid picture book world. WFT's production will be directed by Elliott Norton Award winner Leigh Barrett with music direction by Elliott Norton Award winner David Freeman Coleman and choreography by WFT favorite Brad Reinking.

"A Year with Frog & Toad was one of the first shows I thought of when considering our theme for the season, a celebration of the power of friendship. The show is the perfect example of how two people, or a frog and a toad, can be different from one another but still care so deeply for each other" says Nick Vargas, WFT Executive Director. "It's a clever piece of musical theater that adapts Lobel's stories in a way that speaks to adults and children alike about the themes of kindness, acceptance, and loyalty.

A Year with Frog and Toad, follows Frog and Toad over the course of a calendar year. The show begins in early spring, as a trio of birds welcome Frog and Toad awake from their winter-long hibernation. From the moment their webbed feet hop out of bed we're off on adventures big and small! From baking the most delicious cookies to riding down a snowy hill, Frog, Toad, and friends have the most eventful year, ending with the two sharing gifts on Christmas Eve. WFT is excited to welcome back **Anthony Pires Jr.** (WFT's *The Addams Family, Matilda the Musical, & Ragtime*) in the role of Frog and ecstatic to have Boston veteran **Will McGarrahan**, making his WFT debut, as Toad.

"I'm thrilled about the opportunity to tell this story now because of its relevance in today's world," says Pires Jr.. "We're living in a time where people are searching for connection and understanding, and this story offers audiences an exploration of those themes in a way that allows people to see themselves and each other with more empathy, making the experience not only entertaining but truly meaningful." McGarrahan adds "A Year with Frog and Toad celebrates the comfort that comes from friendship and simple actions. We all can use a little comfort now with our chosen friends."

Barrett, most recently seen as Alice Beineke in WFT's 2023 production of *The Addams Family* is making her WFT directorial debut with *A Year with Frog and Toad*. When sharing her approach to bring these well loved characters to the stage Barrett says, "Everything you know and love about these characters is all still there! But, we've worked diligently to find ways to explore the BIG feelings these characters have and how can our friends help us navigate them."

Continuing its 44 year tradition, *A Year with Frog and Toad* features performers ages 8 to 14 in the role of Moles. These multi-talented young performers hail from towns and cities from across Massachusetts, the majority of which are making their WFT debut! "Our commitment to casting youth in our productions allows young people in the audience to see themselves on stage, deepening their connection to the story and its themes" says Vargas. "The multi generational dimension of, not only the audience, but the company, is part of what makes seeing a show at WFT special." says Barrett. "I love that representation is an intentional part of Wheelock's story, from the stories, to the cast, and especially to the audiences."

Pires Jr. adds, "Wheelock Family Theatre creates a uniquely immersive and inclusive environment. The productions are crafted with care, not just for the story, but for the whole audience experience. The theatre's commitment to accessibility and community engagement makes each show feel like a shared experience, where everyone can feel like they belong."
